Legislation Report (All)

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AGRICULTURE

HB2584 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

Establishes an on-farm mentoring program to teach and train farmers to utilize a whole farm system approach to agriculture. Appropriates funds as a grant for existing on-farm mentoring programs and a pilot on-farm mentoring program in Maui.

House 2016: Referred to AGR; Was not heard.

HB2586 RELATING TO NUTRIENT CYCLING.

Makes an appropriation for a nutrient cycling center pilot project on Maui. Requires DOA to report on the efficacy of the pilot project.

House 2016: Heard in AGR; Deferred.

**HB2654 RELATING TO THE MOLOKAI IRRIGATION SYSTEM
WATER USERS ADVISORY BOARD.**

Authorizes Molokai irrigation system water users advisory board members to designate an agent, officer, or employee. Removes requirement that members be an active general excise tax licensee.

House 2016: Referred to AGR; Was not heard.

HB1766 RELATING TO LIVESTOCK.

Companion: SB2580

Adds deer to the list of animals included in the theft of livestock offense.

House 2/12/2016: Heard in WAL; Deferred.

HB2657 HD2 SD2 CD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

Amends the Molokai diversified agricultural revolving loan program established by Act 387, SLH 1988, to provide cost reimbursements to Molokai farmers and ranchers to reimburse costs of mandated food safety compliance audits and other related costs.

Senate 6/22/2016: Signed into Act 103, 06/21/2016 (Gov. Msg. No. 1204).

HB455 HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

Prohibits the Department of Agriculture from charging agricultural producers for the costs of food safety certification activities conducted by the department.

Senate 2017: Heard in AEN; Deferred.

HB891 HD1 SD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Companion: SB624

Requires the Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with the office of the governor, to develop a strategic plan to double local food production and exports by 2020. Requires the Department of Agriculture to submit the strategic plan to the legislature prior to the Regular Session of 2018 in order to codify the strategic plan and benchmarks.

Senate 2017: Report adopted; Passed Second Reading as amended (SD1); Referred to WAM; Was not heard.

HB452 HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.

Establishes an Organic Agricultural Products Voluntary Registry established by the Department of Agriculture (HB452 HD1).

HB452 HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.

HB893 RELATING TO HUNTING ON PRIVATE LANDS.

Requires hunters to obtain prior written permission from landowners, occupiers, or holders of private lands to hunt on private lands. Does not affect Native Hawaiian gathering rights.

House 1/27/2017: Referred to WAL/OMH; Was not heard.

HB453 HD1,SD1,CD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

Requires the Department of Agriculture to provide grants to farmers to assist them in paying for the costs of compliance with the FDA Food Safety Modernization Act, FDA regulations, and state food safety laws. Appropriates funds.

House 7/11/2017: Signed into Act 183 (Gov. Msg. No. 1297).

HB455 HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

Prohibits the Department of Agriculture from charging agricultural producers for the costs of food safety certification activities conducted by the department.

Senate 1/17/2018: Re-Referred to AEN; Was not heard.

HB891 HD1 SD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Companion: SB624

Requires the Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with the office of the governor, to develop a strategic plan to double local food production and exports by 2020. Requires the Department of Agriculture to submit the strategic plan to the legislature prior to the Regular Session of 2018 in order to codify the strategic plan and benchmarks.

Senate 4/5/2018: Heard in WAM; Deferred.

HB2462 HD1 SD2 RELATING TO TAX EXEMPTION. Companion: SB2565

Exempts gross proceeds arising from sales of farm equipment and machinery to certain producers of agricultural products from the general excise tax.

Senate 4/26/2018: Referred to Conference Committee; Was not heard.

HB782 HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Companion: SB1149

Appropriates funds to establish a foreign agriculture small equipment pilot program to identify efficient agriculture equipment and retrofit engines to meet the United States Environmental Protection Agency's standards.

House 2/14/2019: Report adopted; Referred to FIN; Not yet heard.

HB261 HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Companion: SB760

Authorizes claims for Important Agricultural Lands Qualified Agricultural Cost tax credit based on costs of rehabilitating former sugar or pineapple plantation lands. Extends sunset on certification of credits to 2029.

House 2/15/2019: Passed Second Reading; Referred to FIN; Not yet heard.

HB1117 HD2 RELATING TO STATE LANDS.

Requires the Board of Agriculture and the Agribusiness Development Corporation to ensure the timely collection of lease payments, track lessees that are in arrears of lease payments, and offer payment plans for lessees in areas. Authorizes the BLNR to allow payment plans for a breach or default of a lease or patent. Prohibits land leased by the Agribusiness Development Corporation from being assigned or sublet without Corporation approval.

House 2/15/2019: Report adopted; Referred to FIN; Not yet heard.

PESTICIDES

HB889 HD1 SD2 RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

Increases the cap on the pesticide use revolving fund.

House 2017: Heard in Conference Committee; Deferred.

HB1302 RELATING TO PESTICIDE USE.

Prohibits the use of any pesticide unless the user is certified by DOA. Requires DOA to include an educational component to the pesticide use certification process. Requires DOA to adopt rules to carry out the purposes of chapter 149A, HRS. Effective 1/1/18.

House 2/2/2017: Heard in EEP; Deferred.

HB889 HD1 SD2 RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

Increases the cap on the pesticide use revolving fund.

Senate 3/15/2018: Referred to Conference Committee; Was not heard.

HB1575 RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

Prohibits the use of any pesticide use unless the user is certified by the Department of Agriculture. Requires DOA to include an educational component in the pesticide use certification process.

House 2/1/2019: Heard in AGR; Deferred.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

HB2653 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTEENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the benefit of the 13th representative district.

House 2/1/2016: Referred to FIN; Was not heard.

HB1451 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTEENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates moneys for capital improvement projects in the 13th representative district.

House 1/30/2017: Referred to FIN; Was not heard.

HB1451 **RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTEENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.**

Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates moneys for capital improvement projects in the 13th representative district.

HB1372 **RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTEENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.**

Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the 13th Representative District.

House 1/28/2019: Referred to FIN; Was not heard.

EDUCATION

HB2655 **RELATING TO EDUCATION.** **Companion: SB2571**

Requires remote schools to be allocated funds using categorical allotments, rather than through the weighted student formula. Defines a remote school as any public school that is a high school located at least a one-hour drive away from the next nearest high school or a high school located on the island of Lana'i, Moloka'i, or Ni'i'hau. Specifies minimum number of teachers for Hana high and elementary school.

House 2/1/2016: Referred to EDN; Was not heard.

HB2656 **RELATING TO EDUCATION.**

Requires remote schools to be allocated funds using categorical allotments, rather than through the weighted student formula. Defines a remote school as any public school that is a high school located at least a one-hour drive away from the next nearest high school or a high school located on the island of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau.

House 2/1/2016: Referred to EDN; Was not heard.

HB2583 **RELATING TO EDUCATION.** **Companion: SB2573**

Requires principals to consult with teachers and school community councils when expending moneys provided to their schools. Requires the weighted student formula to include a superintendent's reserve to address needs at unique and remote schools. Grants the DOE discretion in allocating superintendent's reserve funds to specific schools; provided that the committee on weights shall recommend the amount of the reserve and criteria for use of the reserve.

House 2/10/2016: Heard in EDN; Deferred.

HB892 RELATING TO MOLOKAI HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS.

Appropriates funds for Molokai High School athletics to account for increasing travel costs and other expenses. Appropriates funds.

House 1/27/2017: Referred to EDN; Was not heard.

HB890 RELATING TO BULLYING.

Requires the Department of Education to establish policies to prohibit bullying. Requires those policies to include anti-bullying classes for students found to have engaged in bullying and the parents or guardians of those students. Requires suspension of any student found to have engaged in bullying until the student and the student's parent or guardian have successfully completed an anti-bullying class at the parent's or guardian's expense.

House 1/27/2017: Referred to EDN; Was not heard.

HB890 RELATING TO BULLYING.

Requires the Department of Education to establish policies to prohibit bullying. Requires those policies to include anti-bullying classes for students found to have engaged in bullying and the parents or guardians of those students. Requires suspension of any student found to have engaged in bullying until the student and the student's parent or guardian have successfully completed an anti-bullying class at the parent's or guardian's expense.

House 1/27/2017: Referred to EDN; Was not heard.

HB1454 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Exempts remote schools from the weighted student formula. Provides that remote schools will be funded based on categorical allotments that guarantee the funding of a minimum number of instructional and support staff positions to ensure that at least minimum course requirements are maintained. Defines "remote school." Makes appropriations.

House 1/30/2017: Referred to EDN; Was not heard.

HB2260 RELATING TO EDUCATION FUNDING. Companion: SB2680

Requires the Legislative Reference Bureau to conduct a study on the impact of the weighted student formula on small and remote schools to determine whether the formula fulfills its statutory purpose of equalizing operational funding among the State's public schools.

House 2/7/2018: Heard in EDN; Deferred.

HB783 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Exempts remote schools from the weighted student formula. Provides that remote schools will be funded based on categorical allotments that guarantee the funding of a minimum number of instructional and support staff positions to ensure that no less than minimum course requirements are maintained. Defines "remote school". Appropriates funds.

House 1/28/2019: Referred to LHE; Was not heard.

HB781

**RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
EDUCATION.**

Companion: SB856

Requires the Auditor to perform a financial and management audit of the Department of Education, Superintendent, Board of Education, and complex areas every three years.

House 1/28/2019: Referred to LHE; Was not heard.

ENVIRONMENT

HB1453

RELATING TO PROTECTION OF NATURAL RESOURCES.

Imposes a \$20 per guest tax on users of transient accommodations for the purposes of funding conservation efforts.

House 1/30/2017: Referred to TOU; Was not heard.

HB1118

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY.

Establishes a reusable utensil pilot project in the Department of Education schools on Molokai. Requires the Department of Education to report to the legislature on the feasibility of statewide implementation. Appropriates funds.

House 1/28/2019: Referred to LHE; Was not heard.

HB264

**RELATING TO RESOURCE LAND
ACQUISITION PLAN.**

Companion: SB703

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to prepare a resource land acquisition plan by 6/30/2021. Requires periodic reporting to the Legislature on the progress of preparing the plan.

CORAL REEFS & MARINE

HB1765 HD1 RELATING TO CORAL.

Requires UH to conduct a study on the effects of sunscreen on Hawaii's coral reefs.

Appropriates funds.

House 2/16/2016: Heard in HED, Deferred.

HB450 HD1 SD1 RELATING TO CORAL.

Requires UH to conduct a study on the effects of sunscreen on Hawaii's coral reefs and report to the Legislature. Appropriates funds.

House 4/28/2017: Referred to Conference Committee; Was not heard.

HB1300 HD1 SD1 RELATING TO CORAL.

Requires the Hawaii institute of marine biology at UH to conduct ongoing studies of the environmental impacts of sewage spills on affected coral reefs. Requires the institute of marine biology to submit an annual report to the legislature prior to the convening of each regular session. Appropriates funds.

Senate 3/24/2017: Report adopted.

HB1304 HD1 SD1 RELATING TO MARINE EVENTS.

Requires a permit from the Department of Land and Natural Resources before holding a regatta, marine parade, or surfing contest. Requires permit applications to be submitted up to one year and at least forty-five days before the start of the proposed event. Allows DLNR to assess and collect a fee for permit processing. Requires DLNR to collect a deposit that is nonrefundable if the event is canceled within sixty days of the start of the event.

Senate 3/24/2017: Report adopted; Passed Second Reading as amended (SD1); Referred to WAM.

HB2463 RELATING TO PRESERVING CORAL REEFS. Companion: SB2985

Prohibits the sale of sunscreen or personal care products that contain oxybenzone or octinoxate in Hawaii, beginning 1/1/2023.

House 1/29/2018: Referred to EEP; Was not heard.

HCR114 HD1/HR102 REQUESTING THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY TO COLLABORATE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CAMPAIGN TO EDUCATE VISITORS TO THE STATE ABOUT THE HARMFUL EFFECTS OF OXYBENZONE SUNSCREEN ON CORAL REEFS AND TO ENCOURAGE VISITORS TO THE STATE TO REFRAIN FROM USING OXYBENZONE SUNSCREENS.

House 3/28/2018: Report adopted.

HB450 HD1 SD1 RELATING TO CORAL.

Requires UH to conduct a study on the effects of sunscreen on Hawaii's coral reefs and report to the Legislature. Appropriates funds.

Senate 3/15/2018: Referred to Conference Committee; Was not heard.

HB2259 HD1 SD3 CD1 RELATING TO MARINE EVENTS.

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to allow applications for marine event permits up to one year in advance and authorizes the Department to adopt rules to mitigate hazards posed by vessels, thrill craft, drones, and other means used by spectators to observe or record marine events. Requires a report to the 2019 Legislature.

Senate 7/11/2018: Signed into Act 156, 07/09/2018 (Gov. Msg. No. 1265).

HB1573 RELATING TO PROTECTION OF STREAMS. Companion: SB1488

Prohibits dispositions that authorize diverting water from East Maui county streams for commercial purposes, except for existing water uses by the Maui County Department of Water Supply.

House 1/28/2019: Referred to WLH; Was not heard.

HB784 RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY. Companion: SB266

Requires and appropriates funds for the Hawaii tourism authority to promote Hawaii's efforts to protect the environment, marine life conservation districts, and coral reefs and provide guidance on the dangers of sunscreens that contain oxybenzone and octinoxate and how tourists can help protect Hawaii's environment.

House 1/28/2019: Referred to TIA; Was not heard.

INVASIVE SPECIES

HB454 RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

Authorizes departments that are members of the invasive species council to require landowners with land that contains invasive species to control or eradicate the invasive species if the landowner does not permit.

House 2017: Heard in AGR; Deferred.

HB1301 HD2 RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

Provides that a person or entity that is determined by the Hawaii Invasive Species Council to have introduced an invasive species into the State may be strictly liable for all or part of the expenses to eradicate the invasive species from the State.

Senate 1/17/2018: Re-Referred to AEN; Was not heard.

HB2261 RELATING TO SEWAGE SPILLS.

Requires the Hawaii Institute of Marine Biology at the University of Hawaii to conduct ongoing studies of the impacts of sewage spills on human health and affected coral reefs. Requires the Institute of Marine Biology to submit an annual report to the Legislature prior to the convening of each regular session. Appropriates funds.

House 1/26/2018: Referred to EEP/OMH; Was not heard.

HB265 HD1 RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES. Companion: SB697

Appropriates funds to the Department of Land and Natural Resources for the management of the axis deer population and substantial reduction and eradication of other invasive species in Maui County.

House 2/7/2019: Passed Second Reading; Referred to EEP; Not yet heard.

HAWAIIAN ISSUES

HB1931 HD1 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT.

Reduces the minimum Hawaiian blood quantum requirement of certain successors to lessees of Hawaiian home lands from one-quarter to one thirty-second.

House 2/9/2016: Passed Second Reading; Referred to JUD; Was not heard.

HB1932 HD2 SD1 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS. Companion: SB3029

Appropriates general funds for reimbursement of administration and operating expenses of the department of Hawaiian home lands for fiscal year 2016.

Senate 3/23/2016: Report adopted; Passed Second Reading.

HB1303 RELATING TO HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE.

Appropriates funds to the University of Hawai'i translate the Hawai'i state constitution into the Hawaiian language.

House 1/30/2017: Referred to OMH; Was not heard.

HB451 HD1 SD2 CD1 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT. Companion: SB849

Reduces the minimum Hawaiian blood quantum requirement of certain successors to lessees of Hawaiian home lands from one-quarter to one thirty-second.

Senate 7/7/2017: Signed into Act 080, 07/05/2017

HCR115/103 URGING THE FULL IMPLEMENTATION OF RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE NATIVE HAWAIIAN TASK FORCE, PU'UHONUA SUMMIT, AND JUSTICE CENTER AS A COMPREHENSIVE CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM TO REDUCE THE INCARCERATED POPULATION, INCLUDING THE NATIVE HAWAIIAN INCARCERATED POPULATION, BY TWENTY-FIVE PERCENT BY 2023.

House 3/13/2018: Referred to OMH/PBS; Was not heard (HR103)

HB2464 HD2 SD2 CD1 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT. Companion: SB2984

Requires the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to conduct a study on the issue of Hawaiian Home Lands lessees selling or transferring their leases for a fee or other personal gain and then applying for a subsequent lease and submit a report of the findings and recommendations of its study, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2020.

House 7/11/2018: Signed into Act 179, 07/10/2018 (Gov. Msg. No. 1288).

HB1119 RELATING TO STATE HOLIDAYS. Companion: SB1451

Reestablishes La Ku'oko'a, Hawaiian Recognition Day, as an official state holiday.

House 2/1/2019: Re-referred to TIA; Was not heard.

HB259 HD1 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT. Companion: SB695

Requires the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to digitize its applicant, beneficiary, and lessee records and create a usable digital database no later than July 1, 2020. Appropriates funds.

House 2/15/2019: Report adopted.

HEALTH

HB1900 HD1 RELATING TO ADDRESS CONFIDENTIALITY. Companion: SB2318

Establishes the address confidentiality program to help survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking to relocate and keep their addresses confidential. Appropriates funds.

House 2/12/2016: Passed Second Reading; Referred to JUD; Was not heard.

HB2582 HD1 SD1 CD1 RELATING TO FOOD SAFETY.

Requires the Department of Agriculture to develop and implement an Agricultural Food Safety Certification Program that concurrently complies with the FDA Food Safety Modernization Act as it applies to farmers and ranchers. Authorizes and appropriates funds for program staff.

Senate 6/22/2016: Signed into Act 106, 06/21/2016 (Gov. Msg. No. 1207).

HB673 HD1 **RELATING TO CHILD CARE FACILITIES.** **Companion: SB511**
Requires the Department of Human Services to post on its website, reports of child care facility inspections and corrective actions taken by the facility. Requires annual reporting to the Legislature on records and actions involving violation complaints. Appropriates funds.
House 2/9/2017: Passed Second Reading; Referred to FIN; Was not heard.

HCR138/HR87 **REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO STUDY THE EFFECTIVENESS OF SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING.**
House 3/14/2017: Referred to HLT; Was not heard.

HB673 HD1 **RELATING TO CHILD CARE FACILITIES.** **Companion: SB511**
Requires the Department of Human Services to post on its website, reports of child care facility inspections and corrective actions taken by the facility. Requires annual reporting to the Legislature on records and actions involving violation complaints. Appropriates funds. (HB673 HD1)
House 1/17/2018: Re-referred to HHS; Was not heard.

HB2670 HD2 SD1 **RELATING TO THE SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.** **Companion: SB2398**
Requires and appropriates funds for the Department of Agriculture to create a local produce dollar-for-dollar matching program for beneficiaries of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.
Senate 4/26/2018: Referred to Conference Committee; Was not heard.

HB489 **RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.** **Companion: SB1037**
Amends the offense of strangulation of a family or household member to include blocking the nose or mouth of the person or applying excessive pressure to the chest. Clarifies that infliction of visible injury is not required to establish the offense.
House 2/13/2019: Heard by JUD; Deferred.

HB262 HD1 **RELATING TO SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM INCENTIVES.** **Companion: SB390**
Requires the Department of Agriculture to create a dollar-for-dollar matching program for beneficiaries of the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program who use their benefits to purchase Hawaii-grown produce. Appropriates funds.
House 2/14/2019: Passed Second Reading; Referred to FIN; Not yet heard.

HB1574 HD2 **RELATING TO ELECTRONIC SMOKING** **Companion: SB1405**
PRODUCTS.

Establishes the offense of unlawful shipment of e-liquid products. Includes e-liquid within the definition of "tobacco products", as used in the cigarette tax and tobacco tax law. Increases the license fee for persons engaged as a wholesaler or dealer of cigarettes and tobacco products. Increases the retail tobacco permit fee for retailers engaged in the retail sale of cigarettes and tobacco products. Allocates a portion of collected excise taxes on tobacco products to the Tobacco Prevention and Control Trust Fund. Repeals certain provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes relating to electronic smoking devices.

House 2/15/2019: Referred to FIN; Was not heard.

SUICIDE PREVENTION

HB1452 **RELATED TO SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING.**

Requires teachers and principals training to include suicide prevention. Allows the training to be conducted through self-review.

House 1/30/2017: Referred to EDN; Was not heard.

HB1452 **RELATED TO SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING.**
